Read daily with your child Sing the ABC's.


Talk about

# ABOUT OUR PROGRAM


Play is one of the most important ways that young children learn.

The classroom is divided into different areas known as learning centers. These centers exist to reinforce language, math, science and social, as well as creative, physical, spiritual and emotional growth. Centers will change throughout the year.

# DAY IN KINDERGARTEN



Carpet (gather as a class, prayer and discuss our day)

Table work (small group instruction the students are divided into 3 groups that they will rotate through for that week)

Snack (prayer and a washroom break)

Centers (free play in literacy, numeracy, religious focused centers that students are involved in creating)

Carpet (prayer, literacy activities and a story)





# ITERACY



#### Daily Sound Practice:

• We practice our sounds every day through activities like singing, rhyming, and sound games.

#### Incorporating Letters:

• Letters are integrated throughout the day during carpet (gathering) time and center (free play) activities.

#### Phonological Awareness:

• We work on phonological awareness with activities such as clapping syllables and identifying beginning sounds.

#### Comprehension Skills:

• Strategies to improve comprehension include storytelling, discussing stories, and asking questions.

### Question Asking:

• We encourage children to ask questions to develop their critical thinking and curiosity.

 We work on our numeracy skills in various engaging ways throughout the day.

#### • Calendar Time:

- Incorporate patterning and counting activities.
- Count the number of days we have been in school.
- Use fingers to represent the counted number.
- Hands-On Learning:
  - Hands-on approach helps children understand numbers and their representations.
- Additional Concepts:
  - Explore shapes, measurements, and simple arithmetic.
  - Use interactive games and activities.
- Supportive Environment:
  - Ensure children develop a strong foundation in numeracy in a fun and supportive environment.
